Recruitment: Gap Year

Church Mission Society has been supporting people in mission around the world for more than 200 years, so we've built up relationships with many global partners. This means that your brief time of four months to one year with CMS can help build long-term work. We want to extend this challenge to young adults aged 18–25, to lend a hand in the work God is doing in numerous communities around the world.

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Where will I go and what will I do?

Church Mission Society has good relationships with church networks, community-based organisations and NGOs in Africa, Asia, the Middle East, Europe and Latin America. This means we have access to a wide range of mission opportunities.

You will be placed alongside current CMS mission partners or local partners to join in with the work they are already doing. This way you will be in the thick of it, helping with and enriching the activities our partners are involved with, and seeing how God is working both in his partners and by his Spirit in the context.

How to apply



To join our Gap programme, you need to fill in an enquiry form and we'll invite you in for a series of vocational interviews. During the interviews we'll chat with you about placements and answer any questions you have. If after the first interview we are both happy to proceed, we will take up references and invite you for a second interview, where you will have an opportunity to speak with the CMS manager for the region you are planning to go to if you have not done so already.

Training and preparation



Before you head off overseas, you'll be prepared for the experience through our 12-day residential training course. During this formative time you will meet other people going overseas, be challenged in your thinking and faith, and learn more about Church Mission Society. We will also get a medical clearance and a DBS check done.



Recruitment: Process

Complete an enquiry form and return it to CMS with your CV. Attend an initial interview at CMS House in Oxford where we can begin to get to know you and you can discover more about CMS. If after first interview we are both happy to proceed we will:

 invite you for follow
up interviews, take up three references
(clergy/church leader, employer/tutor, personal), share your details with regional managers who will begin considering placements and locations.

If both you and we are happy then we will select you for a Gap placement subject to DBS check, medical clearance and your location being confirmed. We will ask you to complete a Gap agreement and return it to us together with payment of £500 towards your health clearance, DBS check, a contribution to training and a debrief upon your return.

Attend follow up interviews at CMS House in Oxford where we will explore further issues relevant to cross-cultural mission. You will also meet relevant regional managers to discuss potential placements and locations.

You will attend for Mission, which is our 12-day residential CMS induction and training.

About 6 weeks prior to your departure, we will process your final health clearance through Thrive Worldwide.



Recruitment: Details



Support

CMS has been supporting people overseas for more than 200 years and all of our placements have been set up with good local supervision in place. You will also be assigned a regional personnel officer, part of the CMS UK staff team, who will be your first port of call. They will keep in touch with you before, during and after your placement to help you deal with any issues. CMS regional managers travel regularly to the regions and may be able to visit you during your time in location. As well as all this we are signed up to the Global Connections Code of Best Practice, which ensures we are meeting a high standard in the running of our programmes.



After you return

When you return to the UK, you will visit the CMS office again for a debrief with the regional personnel officer and the regional manager.

Church Mission Society is a community of people in mission and we invite you to continue to network with like-minded people near you and through the alumni network, Meraki. We also offer opportunities to contribute to the life of the community in various ways.

Overall, we hope that this time away will just be the beginning of your missional life! If you're off to university or a first job we hope you'll be as much alive with eyes open to mission there as you were overseas.



Costs

We require a support charge of £500 to contribute towards the costs of the training, as well as a medical clearance and a DBS check.

You will be responsible for all your financial costs, including travel/transport, living costs, health cover and travel insurance. We may be able to offer advice on how much you would need to budget for. In our experience you would need to raise $\pm 5-8,000$ per year, depending on location.
