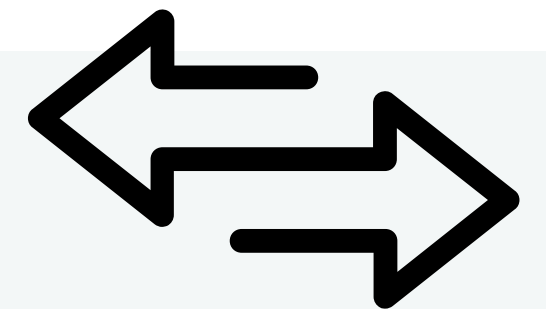

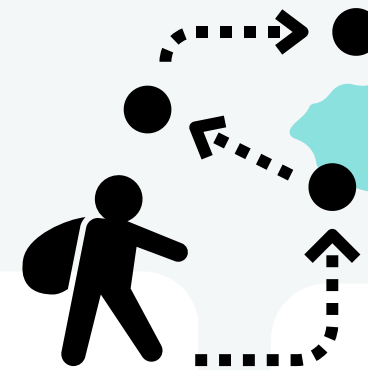

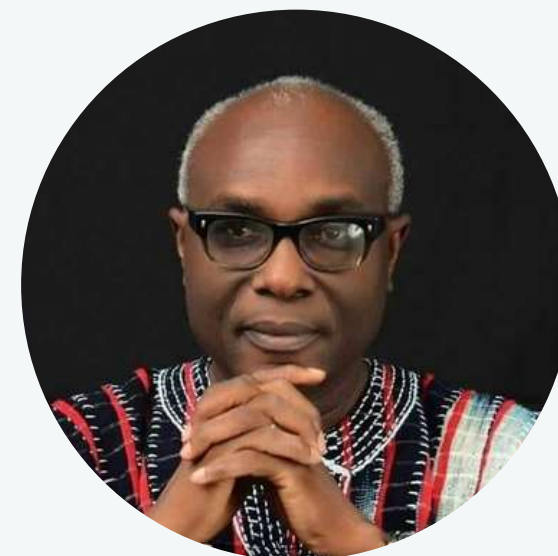

Dr Sheila Akomiah-Conteh

Sheila Akomiah-Conteh is a theologian and emerging scholar in missiology, with a particular focus on expressions of the Christian faith among Africans in diaspora communities in Europe. She lectures on the African Christianity programme at CMS Oxford.



Prof. Kwabena Asamoah-Gyadu

Kwabena Asamoah-Gyadu is a Ghanaian theologian and scholar of African Christianity, Pentecostalism, and new religious movements. He is the President of Trinity Theological Seminary in Accra, Ghana, and a noted author on the dynamics of African charismatic movements.



Pr Alex Brito

Alex Brito, originally from Brazil, moved to London to establish Mosaic Multicultural Church in Elephant and Castle with the backing of the Co-Mission Church Planting Network, The London Project, and the Intercultural Church Planting Network. He also serves as a catalyst for the London Project, an initiative of City to City.



Rev. Dr Chigor Chike

Chigor Chike is a Nigerian theologian and church leader based in the UK, focusing on African Christianity in diaspora and intercultural ecclesiology. He serves as a priest in the Church of England where he is the Archdeacon of Lewisham and Greenwich in the Diocese of Southwark.



Sarah Clarke

Sarah leads the undergraduate programme at CMS Oxford. She has a master's in theology, and is currently pursuing a PhD in art, theology and community formation.



Prof. Gregor Etzelmüller

Gregor Etzelmüller is a German theologian and professor who is recognised for his contributions to systematic theology and the dialogue between science and religion. His work often explores the intersections of theology with contemporary cultural and philosophical thought.



Louisa Evans

Louisa is a lecturer at All Nations Christian College, where she teaches on the En Route, BA, and MA programs. Previously, she served as a College Students' Pastor in Malaysia, ministering to international students and migrant workers.



Prof. Moritz Fischer

Moritz Fischer is a theologian and scholar known for his research on contextual theology and the interaction of Christian mission with indigenous cultures. He is involved in academic discourse on postcolonial theology and mission in African contexts.



Prof. Jehu Hanciles

Jehu Hanciles is a distinguished missiologist and historian, known for his work on the global expansion of Christianity and its implications for the contemporary church. He is currently a professor at the Candler School of Theology at Emory University, where he specialises in the study of African Christianity and migration.



Dr Nuam Hatzaw

Nuam Hatzaw is an emerging leader in missiology with a focus on the integration of cultural anthropology and mission studies. Her doctoral research explores the impact of Christianity in Southeast Asian contexts, particularly among the Chin people.



Dr Easten Law

Easten Law is an academic and theologian specialising in interfaith dialogue and Asian–American Christianity. He is currently the Associate Director of Academic Programs at the Overseas Ministries Study Center at Princeton Theological Seminary and Co-Editor of International Bulletin of Mission Research.



Dr Leita Ngoy

Leita Ngoy is an East African theologian and missiologist with a Lutheran background. Her PhD research was on charismatic Pentecostal movements in Tanzania, which she completed at Ruhr Universität, Germany.



Pr Joseph Ola

Joseph Ola is a Nigerian pastor, youth mentor, and scholar who lectures on African Christianity at CMS Oxford. His ongoing doctoral research explores generational differences in spiritual disciplines among Nigerian Pentecostals in the UK.



Dr Gina Zurlo

Gina Zurlo is a leading researcher in global Christianity, serving as the Co-Director of the Center for the Study of Global Christianity at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary. Her work focuses on religious demographics and trends, contributing significantly to understanding world Christianity.



Angelina Quamina MBE

Angelina Quamina MBE is a graduating student of the African Christianity programme at CMS. Being of West Indian heritage, Angelina's life and work have been about the Christian faith and migration. She teaches migrants about the culture, laws and other facets of living in Britain.



Dr Cathy Ross

Cathy Ross is a respected theologian and missiologist specialising in contextual theology, intercultural studies, and feminist perspectives in mission. She leads Pioneer Mission Leadership Training at Church Mission Society, Oxford and is a lecturer in mission at Regent's Park College and Ripon College Cuddesdon.



Dr Harvey Kwiyani

Harvey Kwiyani is a leading missiologist and theologian from Malawi, focusing on the intersection of mission, migration, and Global Witness. He is the founder of Missio Africanus and he leads the Acts 11 Project and its Centre for Global Witness and Human Migration at Church mission Society Oxford.
